ABOUT

The International Studies Research Lab (ISRL) promotes the development and enhancement of international programs and curriculum with an emphasis on community college and minorityserving institutions nationwide. The Center for Global Studies (CGS) invites applications from faculty, librarians, and administrators interested in expanding global and area studies curricula, instruction in less commonly taught languages, library collections, or international education programs at their home institutions. CGS is a National Resource Center supported by Title VI funds from the U.S. Department of Education to develop opportunities like ISRL.

DATES

The lab will be held in a hybrid format from June 3-August 1, 2024.

RESEARCH SUPPORT

CGS will connect you with subject librarians from the university's International & Area Studies Library to provide specialized reference support for your research needs. The library has an extensive service that facilitates access to a wide range of materials related to globalization and global and regional studies. These collections come from Africa, China, the EU, Japan, Korea, Latin America and the Caribbean, North Africa and the Middle East, Russia, Eastern Europe and Eurasia, and South Asia.

REQUIREMENTS

Applications due by Monday March 25, 2024. To apply, you must be faculty or an administrator at a 2-year community college or a 4-year minority serving institution.

To demonstrate the extent of your research by the end of the lab, you are expected to submit a research or program plan. This can be a draft or current syllabus, an abstract and white paper, a library collection development abstract, or a draft plan for a new international education program. These materials will be workshopped, peer reviewed and published our institutional repository, IDEALS.

FUNDING

Participation in the ISRL provides resources and time for research otherwise unavailable to applicants as visiting researchers at the University of Illinois. ISRL offers the opportunity and funding to assist with the creation of materials to help internationalize curriculum or college.

Each participant is eligible for a travel/lodging stipend to support attendance of the in-person workshop activities that take place from June 10 - 14.

Participants will receive a \$1,000 research stipend contingent upon receipt of completed research materials. Visit our website for more details.
